Rules and Expectations

- Come to class prepared and ready to learn. The following materials
 <u>MUST</u> accompany the student to class <u>EVERY</u> day: textbook, three (3)
 ring binder, calculator, and writing implement(s).
- 2. Respect everybody in the classroom. This would include the following: teacher, substitute teacher, and fellow students. Inappropriate language/behavior will not be tolerated.
- 3. The use of electronic devices shall be prohibited in the classroom (see student/parent handbook). Cell phones cannot be used for a calculator (see #1).
- 4. Follow **LAB SAFETY** at all times. **NO** food or drinks are allowed during laboratories (as well as lectures). Please keep handle all laboratory equipment with care. If you notice any defects in materials, inform the teacher.
- 5. Talking while others are talking is disrespectful (see #2). Therefore, if someone is talking, everybody else should be silent. If you are talking, you may miss out on important information that will not be repeated.
- 6. Laboratory reports are due four (4) days from day performed. For example: if an experiment is performed on a Monday, then it would be due on that Thursday. Late reports will be penalized 10 pts per day (due date counts as 1 day late). If a report is not turned two (2) days after assigned due date, it is recorded as a zero. Experiments **MUST** be made up within 1 week or a zero will be recorded. If you are absent on due date, email the report to me (papaleop@sbregional.org) or give it to a classmate.
